- **State Historic Preservation Board to meet April 24**

The North Dakota State Historic Preservation Review Board will meet Friday, April 24 at 10 a.m. at the North Dakota Heritage Center in Bismarck. The meeting is open to the public. Board members will consider Trinity Lutheran Church in Grant County and the residence at 1019 Reeves Drive in Grand Forks for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. The board will also consider an update to the nomination information for Double Ditch State Historic Site in Burleigh County based on recent years' archaeological findings at the site. Double Ditch was originally listed in the National Register in 1979.

The National Trust's regional and field offices bring the programs and tools of the National Trust to communities across the country. They offer technical services and financial assistance to support local, state and regional preservation efforts. Regional offices provide educational programming, organize member volunteer opportunities, and advocate for preservation-friendly public policies at the local, state and national level. Regional offices also provide key leadership to address issues that affect historic places at the regional or national level, such as saving historic schools, fighting sprawl, or slowing the teardown trend.

## Grant Opportunities

- **Save America's Treasures**

Applications for National Park Service Save America's Treasures grants are now available. The program is one of the largest and most successful grant programs for the protection of our nation's irreplaceable and endangered cultural heritage. Grants are available for preservation and/or conservation work on nationally significant intellectual and cultural artifacts and historic structures and sites. Eligible applicants include federal, state, local, and tribal government entities, and nonprofit organizations. The competitive matching-grant

program is administered by the National Park Service in partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Institute of Museum and Library Services and the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities. - **NEH Preservation Assistance Grants**

Preservation Assistance Grants for Smaller Institutions help small and mid-sized institutions, such as libraries, museums, historical societies, archival repositories, town and county records offices, and colleges, improve their ability to preserve and care for their humanities collections. Awards of up to \$6,000 support preservation related collection assessments, consultations, training and workshops, and institutional and collaborative disaster and emergency planning. Grants cover consultant fees, workshop registration fees, related travel and per diem expenses, and the costs of purchasing and shipping preservation supplies and equipment.
