SHPO News

- **CLG Workshop**
The 2009 CLG Workshop will be held September 19 in Fargo, look for more information in the coming weeks.
- **Federal Minimum Wage Increase**
Starting July 1, 2009 the federal minimum wage increased to \$7.25, all commission member match salary that are below this level can be raised to the new minimum wage. Raises will also continue to occur at 3% on the anniversary date of the commission member and each member will receive a 10% raise for attending the CLG workshop each year.
- **2009 HPF Development Grants Awarded**
Development Projects are for improvements to properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places. For this grant cycle, the SHPO received applications requesting more than \$280,000. A total of \$90,000 was awarded:
 - Keith & Meridee Danks owners of 717 Reeves Drive, Grand Forks were awarded \$25,000 for the re-shingling of the false thatched roof of their historic home.
 - Hatton Museum & Historical Society were awarded \$5,000 to repair and restoration of the dining room bay window.
 - Grand Forks County Fair & Exposition were awarded \$5,500 for electrical upgrades to the grandstand.
 - Brian & Anne Hinderliter owners of 1222 S. 9th Street in Fargo received a grant of \$17,000 for masonry repairs and tuck pointing of their historic home
 - Barbara McCormick & Glen Jorde owners of the Devils Lake Masonic Temple were awarded \$12,410 for roof restoration.
 - City of Valley City and the Bridges Arts Council owners of the Valley City Municipal Auditorium were awarded \$25,000 for window restoration.
