



**Heritage Training Scholarships are available through the Cultural Heritage Grant Program**

In 2011, the North Dakota Legislative Assembly authorized \$504,500 to the State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) for the Cultural Heritage Grant Program. The Cultural Heritage Grant Program has been administered by the SHSND since it was first created in 2003 and provides grant funding for local museums and historical societies, including exhibits, special projects or events, education activities, collections, and capital improvements.

Heritage Training Scholarships are available for local and county historical society staff members to participate in training opportunities. Each individual

can apply for any number of scholarships throughout the biennium, though the total amount awarded cannot exceed \$2,000 per individual. Funds for the scholarship program will be awarded until the fund is exhausted. \_\_\_\_\_


