Guidelines

I. Award Objective

The North Dakota Person of History Award is given in recognition of those individuals who have had a prominent role in the history of the state of North Dakota. The award shall posthumously honor those individuals who have made a lasting or significant contribution to the growth, development, and progress of the state, or the social well-being of its citizens, who have achieved acclaim or prominence in their chosen fields of endeavor, and/or have had a profound effect upon the history of the state or the lives of its people. To be eligible, a nominee for this honor must have been deceased at least ten years.

II. Award Nominations

- A. Nominations may be developed by state officials, legislators, county and local officials, members of the State Historical Board, historical organizations, other associations, or private citizens residing in North Dakota.
- B. Nominations may be submitted to the Communications and Education Division of the State Historical Society of North Dakota. A special committee will select the award recipient.
- C. Nominations must be accompanied by a resumé of not more than 250 words that cites the contributions of the nominee related to the award's objective.

III. Award Nomination Schedule

Nominations may be made for committee consideration by August 14 to be eligible for the award to be given in the fall.

IV. Award Recognition

The observance and presentation of the award will be made at the State Historical Society of North Dakota Foundation's annual meeting.
